

## PSHE at Menston Primary School

At Menston Primary School, personal, social, health and economic (PSHE) education is an embedded part of our broad and balanced curriculum. PSHE education linked closely to SMSC and British Values addresses both pupil's direct experience and also helps to give them the knowledge, skills and understanding they need to develop as confident, healthy and independent individuals, preparing them for their future in the wider society.

We are a CORAM SCARF School and work closely with them to deliver a balanced PSHE curriculum across school which includes Relations Education (RE), Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) and Health Education (HE).

The aim of our PSHE curriculum is to deliver a curriculum which is accessible to all and that will maximise the outcomes for every child. At Menston Primary School, personal, social, health and economic (PSHE) education enables our children to become healthy, independent and responsible members of society. It aims to help them understand how they are developing personally and socially, and tackles many of the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up. We provide our children with opportunities for them to learn about rights and responsibilities and appreciate what it means to be a member of a diverse society. Our children are encouraged to develop their sense of self-worth by playing a positive role in contributing to school life and the wider community.


Opportunities to further children's development in Personal, Social and Health Education are embedded throughout our curriculum including PE and Science.
