## Anti-bullying week

Anti-Bullying Week 2022 is coordinated in England and Wales by the Anti-Bullying Alliance (ABA). It will take place next week from 14 to 18 November and has the theme **Reach Out**. We will be starting the week with **Odd Socks Day on Monday 14 November**, where adults and children can wear odd socks to school to celebrate what makes us all unique.

Learning to understand and manage conflict is an important part of growing up. Bullying is not simply a 'falling out'. Research shows that experiencing bullying can have a significant impact on a child's life well into adulthood. To ensure we are able to prevent bullying, act quickly when it takes place and avoid misidentifying bullying, it is vital that we have a shared definition of bullying. This should be understood by the whole school, including parents, young people and all staff. The ABA definition that we teach to the children is that **bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. ## **100 Miles in October Challenge**

Congratulations to Tom and Max Ratcliffe on completing their fantastic fundraising challenge. Max and Tom, supported by many of their wonderful friends, exceeded their target both in terms of the distance that they ran, walked & cycled and in their fundraising target. The boys themselves achieved a total distance of 163.5 miles, which included lunchtime runs at school and running, walking & cycling after school, at weekends and in the holidays. 40 children and parents joined the Ratcliffe family at the Brownlee cycling track in the half-term holiday, collectively cycling 451 miles in just one hour! The boys have raised a whopping £4503.75 for the <u>Down Syndrome Training and Support Service</u> in Bingley.
