Treacle includes information about (and links to) almost a thousand national and local support services, clubs, charities and other groups in a single digital space.

The site and app are really easy to navigate, using colourful, easy-to-follow visual signposts. It contains no advertising or sponsorship of any kind. Everything on the site can be read in any of 13 languages, including English, Urdu, Gujarati and Ukrainian.
