



Christmas Shows

Keighley and Shipley Family Hub

The Keighley and Shipley Family Hub, part of Bradford Children and Families Trust have updated their timetable. We would like to highlight the 'Jump Aboard' sessions on Wednesdays from 1-3pm where parents can talk through any concerns they have for their child with an Educational Psychologist. This could include help with ADHD, Autism, Speech and Language difficulties, social, emotional and sensory needs.

Message from Annet Nottingham—Chair of our Local Governing Board

Since September we have been operating as an academy of the Moorlands Learning Trust. It is entirely likely that you will not have experienced much, if any change, as school continues to operate in many ways as before under the leadership of Mrs Wilson and her team. Behind the scenes though, work has been done to streamline systems and policies across the Trust. Collaborating more closely with the other primary schools in the Trust (Ashlands Primary and Burley Oaks Primary) has already brought benefits in terms of school improvement and sharing good practice.

In our most recent Local Governing Board meeting we focused on 2023 pupil progress and achievement. Although preliminary results had been shared with schools much earlier, these figures have only recently been officially published. It is one of the main responsibilities of the Board of Governors to analyse and monitor these outcomes in detail. This year's KS1 and KS2 results show further improvement on last year, which were the first since the 2019 pre-Covid results, but are not quite back to the level before Covid. This is the case nationally and in other local schools, but there is clear evidence that children in our school are making strong progress. At EYFS 83% of children achieved Good Level of Development, which is an excellent outcome. We congratulate all staff and pupils on these results and thank them for their hard work.

Areas for further action have been identified and these are included in the School Improvement Plan that guides the school's work to raise standards even further. As important as these results are, of course governors recognise fully that our children's education is not just about academic performance, and we equally value children's general development, wellbeing and happiness.

In the new year the governing body is looking to recruit two new governors: one staff governor and one parent governor. More details will be circulated soon, but I hope you will consider putting yourself forward for this responsible and rewarding

Governors wish to thank all staff and pupils for their hard work and send their very best wishes to pupils, staff, parents and carers for Christmas and 2024.

I want to extend a huge thank you to all of our families for your support again this term. Bear Cub Adoption


