#### **Online Safety Updates**

We have signed up to receive online safety newsletters for families from Knowsley City Learning Centres. #### Parent/Carer Support Group




Please see the attached newsletter from

#### Year 6 Boys' Football

The game got off to a chilly start in the waning January light but midway into the first half the deadlock was broken; Brody scored with a powerful left footed shot to the bottom right corner. Will came out to meet two long balls to thwart a Burley attack and eventually Burley's pressure resulted in a goal to pull the score back to 2-1.

Some wonderful link up play between Luca and Brody nearly proved fruitful and hard work with important tackles from Oscar in defence, Nate and Bilal in midfield almost set Oliver up on our left wing.

Burley fought hard and pressed in the final few minutes but safe hands from Will staved off a threatening strike.

In the dying seconds Menston hit the post and one final run threading through the defence was halted. The final whistle blew, signalling a well-deserved 2-1 victory from a cohesive Menston team.

Solid efforts from Leo and decisive clearances from Gabe along with a tidy first half from Ruben all contributed to this important result.
