Parent/Carer Online Safety Information Session—Wednesday 31st January 2024, 9.30am – 10.15am

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, parents and carers will have the opportunity to attend an online safety webinar delivered by Knowsley City Learning Centres. **The link to access the webinar has been emailed to all parents & carers.**

Attendees do not need to register but simply click on the link on the above date/time to access the session. Cameras and voice/audio will be switched off for all attendees. Attendees can ask questions by typing in the Q&A box, but this will be explained during the session.

The event will be streamed using Teams. Attendees can watch the live event in:

- Teams app—desktop (Windows or Mac) or mobile (the Teams app is free to download if attendees would like to do that beforehand).
- If you don't have the Teams app, you can access it via one of the following browsers - Google Chrome, Microsoft Edge or Firefox.

The webinar will cover the following topics:

- Current trends – what children are doing online and what apps/games are popular amongst children;
- Understanding the risks – a look at the risks associated with using technology, in particular when using social media, online gaming & live streaming;
- What can you do? Suggestions on how you can support your child with their online lives and what parental controls are available to help you;
- Further support – signposting to services that are available to help you.

The session will be recorded and subsequently shared via the Online Safety page of our school website.
