- King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table by Marcia Williams
- The King Who Threw Away His Throne by Terry Deary
- Smashing Saxons by Terry Deary

2 points each:

- Make a labelled timeline with events of this era.
- Research what is meant by the word 'Bretwalda'.
- True or false? The Anglo-Saxons brought Christianity to England.
- Research and draw the difference between how the rich and poor Anglo Saxons dressed.
- Create a message written in runes (this will have to be interpreted!)
- Find out about Anglo-Saxon law and order. Create a wanted poster for a Saxon criminal.

5 points each:

- Research and then compare events in England at this time with those in other places around the world. Use a timeline and historical vocabulary to help you.
- Was King Alfred the Great was actually great and if so, what made him so?
- Construct a model of something that links to the Anglo Saxons. This
 can be presented in any way.
- Design an illuminated letter that were used in Christian scripture by the monks.
- Find out about Anglo-Saxon medicine and how they cured some common ailments such as colds and headaches. Create an advert for one kind of Saxon medicine.
- Visit The Ashmolean Museum Online Collection and search for Anglo-Saxon artefacts. Make notes about 5 artefacts: https://collections.ashmolean.org/collection/search
