
We have six core values, which our children and staff agree are the most important to us here at Menston Primary School.

Our Curriculum



Our curriculum is based on the National Curriculum for England and the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Our pupils are offered a broad range of experiences to extend their understanding of themselves and the world in which they live.





Knowledge, skills, attitudes and values are developed to prepare the children for the next stage of learning (Key Stage 1 and 2 ready and secondary ready), and enable them to be successful in the community and the wider world.

We believe that effective learning takes place when there is considerable emphasis on active involvement alongside opportunities to explain and clarify thinking. We make meaningful connections across subjects.

The school expects everyone to develop and show a sense of responsibility and self-discipline whether alone, together, at work or at play, and to support policies on equal opportunities. We actively promote the British Values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs to prepare our pupils for life in modern day Britain.



We also incorporate careers awareness activities into our teaching to further help to prepare our children for their futures.



We have two Reception classes, Oak and Acorn, which are based in two large, interconnected classrooms.

Children access the full Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum across both classrooms and the dedicated, well-equipped outdoor area.





Our transition for new-starters is highly-regarded and our Year 6 buddy programme ensures that the youngest children have an older friend to support them throughout their first year at school.






The children benefit from rich and diverse learning experiences that include special themed days, visits and visitors into school. We are immensely proud of our outdoor facilities, which include two large fields, two running tracks, two polytunnels, a woodland area, a minibeasting area and our own pond.





Children in Key Stage 2 have regular outdoor learning lessons too. We have a progressive curriculum for pond-dipping and our wonderful outdoor environment enables children to experience hands-on, practical learning across a range of curriculum subjects.

My Happy Mind



Our SENDCo and Deputy Headteacher is Mrs Charlie Gilmour. She has extensive experience as a SENDCo in Bradford and has worked with children from wide-ranging backgrounds and starting points.

Mrs Gilmour also achieved a distinction in the National Award for SEN Co-ordination.

Our Headteacher, Mrs Wilson also has many years of experience as a SENDCo and continues to lead a school with inclusion at its heart, to ensure that we are 'making the world a better place' for everyone.

At Menston Primary School, we support all children with a broad range of additional and Special Educational Needs and Disabilities.





A child or young person has SEND if they have a learning difficulty or disability which requires Special Educational Provision to be made available for them.

We strive to ensure that we provide an education and learning experience for all children which is child-centred. We work closely with parents and families to ensure any SEND support is created in a co-productive way.

Key Information

School Day Timings

Our school gates are open for a ten-minute 'soft landing' for the children at the start of each day.

School gates open between **08:35 and 08:45**. Children can be accompanied to their entry doors by their parents within this ten-minute window. Staff are always on hand to answer any queries during this time.

Our gates close at **08:45** so that registration can take place ready for core lessons to start at **09:00**.



Our site is completely locked-down during the school day between **08:45** and **15:15**. All visitors must report to the main office on St Peter's Way during the school day and use the intercom to speak with a member of the office staff.

Our school day finishes at **15:15** when, once again, our gates will be open for ten minutes to allow parents on-site to collect their children. Our gates close promptly at **15:25** to enable after school clubs and Care Club to move around the secure site.

Care Club

Our before-school and after-school Care Club provides quality childcare between **07:30-08:45 and 15:15-18:00**. Care Club is based in a suite of dedicated playrooms and also outreaches into other areas within school. Care Club also takes advantage of the outdoor play spaces in our school grounds.

Care Club is a popular facility and we recommend that families register interest as early as possible.

School Uniform

An excellent standard of uniform supports excellent standards of behaviour. Wearing the correct uniform also helps children to have a sense of belonging and pride in our school.

We have given consideration to comfort and practicality of the uniform and so ask that all children wear uniform as listed below:

- School sweatshirt or school cardigan with or without logo
- Dark grey/black trousers or plain shorts
- Dark grey/black skirt or pinafore
- Blue and white checked dressed in summer
- White short-sleeved polo shirt
- Plain dark or white socks/plain black tights
- Black sensible school shoes or ankle boots suitable for climbing and outdoor activities
- Hair accessories should be plain blue, black or brown



All clothing must be **fully named,** preferably with iron-on or sewn-in name tags.

PE Uniform

Children can come to school wearing PE uniform on their PE days. It is very important that children wear the correct PE uniform so that they are comfortable and can move freely during their PE lessons:

- Plain black shorts (or plain navy jogging pants)
- Plain white t-shirt
- Plain navy sweatshirt
- Plain black or navy trainers (a small logo on trainers will be accepted)

Children's progress and attainment are maximised when home and school work closely together. We ask our families to support children's home learning, particularly ensuring that children read high quality books every day. Communication

We strive to build strong relationships with parents and carers, in order to help create a stimulating learning environment which continues from school to home and the wider community, providing all our children with the opportunity to achieve their personal best.

Our staff work hard to provide the very best education for our children and we believe it is important for everyone involved with school life to communicate in a positive way, whether in person, on the phone, or online. In this way, staff, children, parents, carers and members of the public convey courtesy and respect to each other at all times, which helps to promote the most constructive working and learning environment.

Communication between home and school takes place in a number of ways:

Face to Face

Gates and doors are staffed at the beginning and end of every day. Quick messages can be passed on at these times, but parents should request an appointment to discuss more in-depth matters. Teachers will request face-to-face meetings with parents wherever they feel that this is necessary. Parent consultation meetings take place twice within each academic year and we encourage all families to attend these meetings.

Each year group has a dedicated email account where emails are checked and responded to by class teachers between **15:30** and **16:30** on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays.
